

## Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+)

Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+) is a national primary care model that aims to strengthen primary care through payor reform and care delivery transformation. In early fall of 2016, nine local primary care practices applied and were accepted in both tracks 1 and 2. This program began on January 1, 2017, and will continue for the next five years. ## Quality Payment Program (QPP)

The Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 (MACRA) has introduced a new value-based reimbursement model that will affect Medicare payments beginning in 2019. This model, Quality Payment Program, repeals the Sustainable Growth Rate formula and combines three existing Medicare programs (Physician Quality Reporting System, Meaningful Use, and Value Modifier) into one, overarching program. QPP offers two tracks for practices to choose from: the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) or Advanced Alternative Payment Models (Advanced APMs). The Lakeland Care Quality Team hosted a webinar in mid-December that provided a brief overview of the program and how it will affect practices. # BCBSM PGIP Updates

- In 2015, PGIP estimated the amount they paid to practices in value-based reimbursement was \$509,885
  - Primary care: \$223,217
  - Specialty: \$286,668
- The following practices will be involved in the first wave of the Lean for Clinical Redesign Initiative, a partnership between BCBSM and the University of Michigan:
  - SWMC Bridgman
  - SWMC Stevensville
  - SWMC Niles: Walk-In
  - Lakeland Ear, Nose and Throat
- The Lean Initiative will begin in mid-February
  - The first wave will take 18 weeks to complete
  - Waves two and three will expand participation to community PCP and specialty practices



# myWeigh to Health New year-round weight loss and lifestyle improvement program for 2017!

myWeigh to Health is a year-round weight management program that provides support, accountability, information, and tools to successfully build healthy habits that promote long-term weight management. This program is held in an interactive supportive group environment, with weekly weigh-ins, expertise from certified health and fitness professionals, and a weekly challenge to practice new skills. No matter how much weight you want to lose or if you just want to improve your lifestyle, our program will meet those needs.

Weekly group class will be held on Tuesdays from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. at the Center for Outpatient Services in the Pharmacy Conference Room. Cost is \$165 per quarter which includes an individual consultation with a registered dietitian (\$220 value); or \$50 per month; or \$15 per week.
