I have the opportunity to join various committees that provide direction to my network for contracting, quality, credentialing and CME.

Being a Lakeland Care physician allows me access to an A-rated professional liability insurance company (MPIE) which gives me preferred rates. I have access to COMET which provides a free library of accredited learning activities which helps me satisfy my Michigan state licensing requirements. My office manager and staff are provided quality education by the Lakeland Medical Office Association (LMOA) to ensure we stay up-to-date with EPIC, state/federal regulations, employment laws, and risk management practices.

I am a part of a state-wide clinically integrated network, known as Affirmant Health Partners. I have access to a local care team which helps me improve my quality, access and value. This team is focused on making my physician experience more patient-centric.


Patient Satisfaction

Physicians know time is of the essence when someone experiences a cardiac episode. To help equip first responders with the tools they need, Lakeland Care Network donated a new Medtronic Lifepack 1000 AED to the village of Galien Police Department. Lakeland Cardiologist, James Huggett, DO, had the honor of presenting the new device to the village in September. The fully automated AED walks first responders through the shock process step-by-step, and even stores the information for easy review when paramedics and EMTs arrive on scene. The hope is that the device will help improve outcomes, and continuity of care, for Galien residents faced with a cardiac emergency.
